L. Region 9 Fish and Wild Life Board: *Greg Tessmann*

Bill Hilts reported pursuant to working out the legal parameters to purchase 4500 acres of the former Seneca Army Depot's designated Conservation/Green Energy Area from the Seneca County Industrial Development Agency for construction of an ethanol plant, Empire Green Biofuels, Inc. (Empire) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with Seneca White Deer, Inc. (SWD) to conduct public wildlife tours on the premises.

M. NYS Conservation Council: *Dale Dunkelberger~ Gerry Bennett*

Gerry Bennett requested that all delegates review the 2007 resolutions with their respected clubs. Gerry reported that the 2007 resolutions are available and copies were distributed to all delegates. Those not present at the May meeting had the resolutions mailed to them. John Butcher contacted Lori Presti from the NYS Power Authority. The meeting basically covered some insurance issues, eligibility to be in the Federation tent and promotion they are going to do.

We will no-longer advertise the Federation as a co-sponsor of the Wildlife Festival because we can be held liable for other activities. The Power Authority will make every participant issue them a certificate of insurance. Our insurance only covers us for liability under the tent but does not cover special activities such as archery or wildlife (such as birds of prey). The Niagara River Anglers Fishing Pond, NCFCC Air Rifle Range and the NYS Cross Bow Hunters Archery Range all provide proof of insurance to the Power Authority Those eligible for booths under the tent are affiliated clubs and those government agencies that assist us such as the US Department of Agriculture and ECO's. Private Business will no-longer be eligible under the NCFCC Tent
